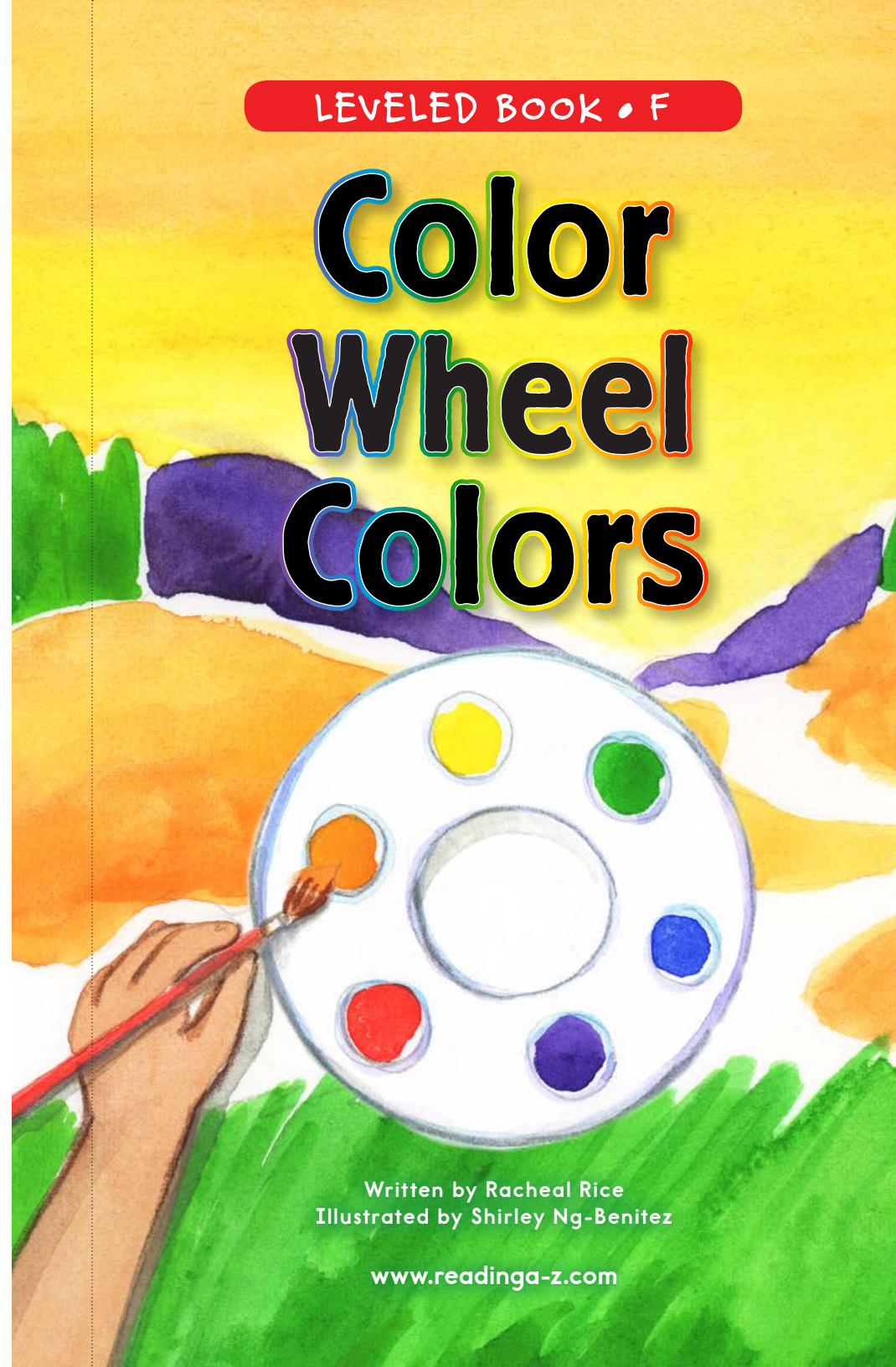

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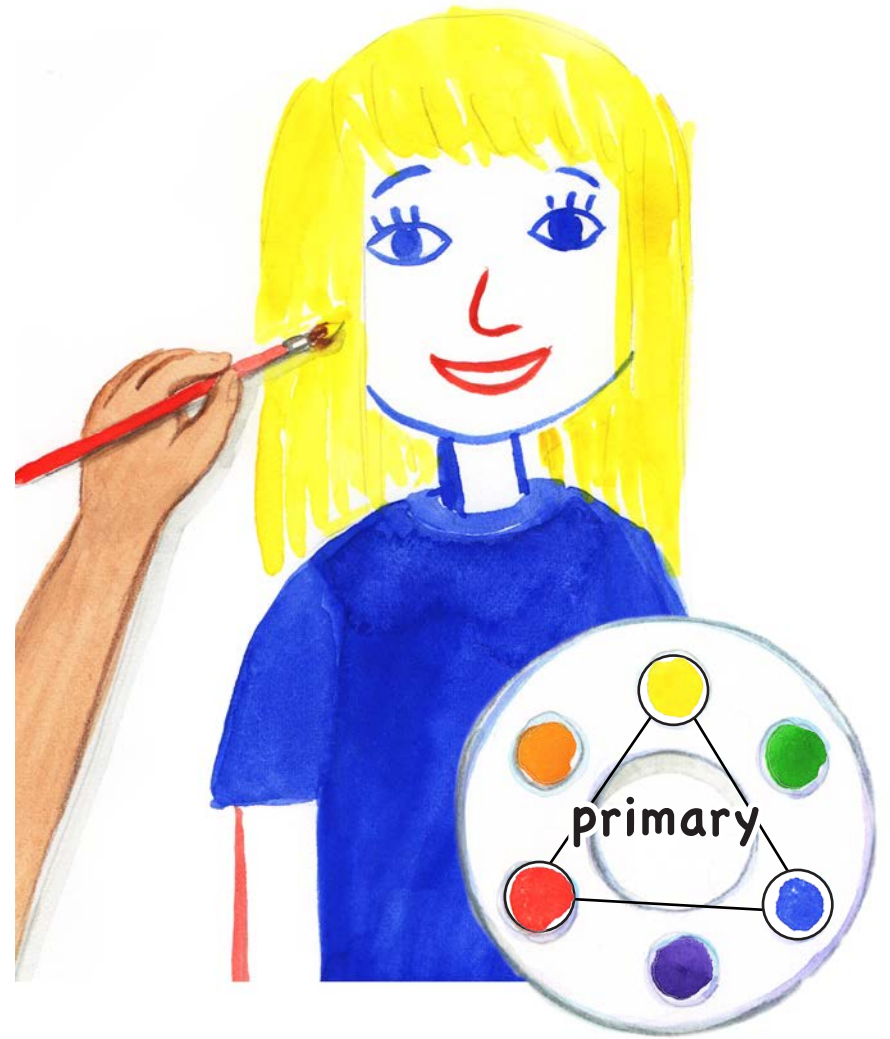

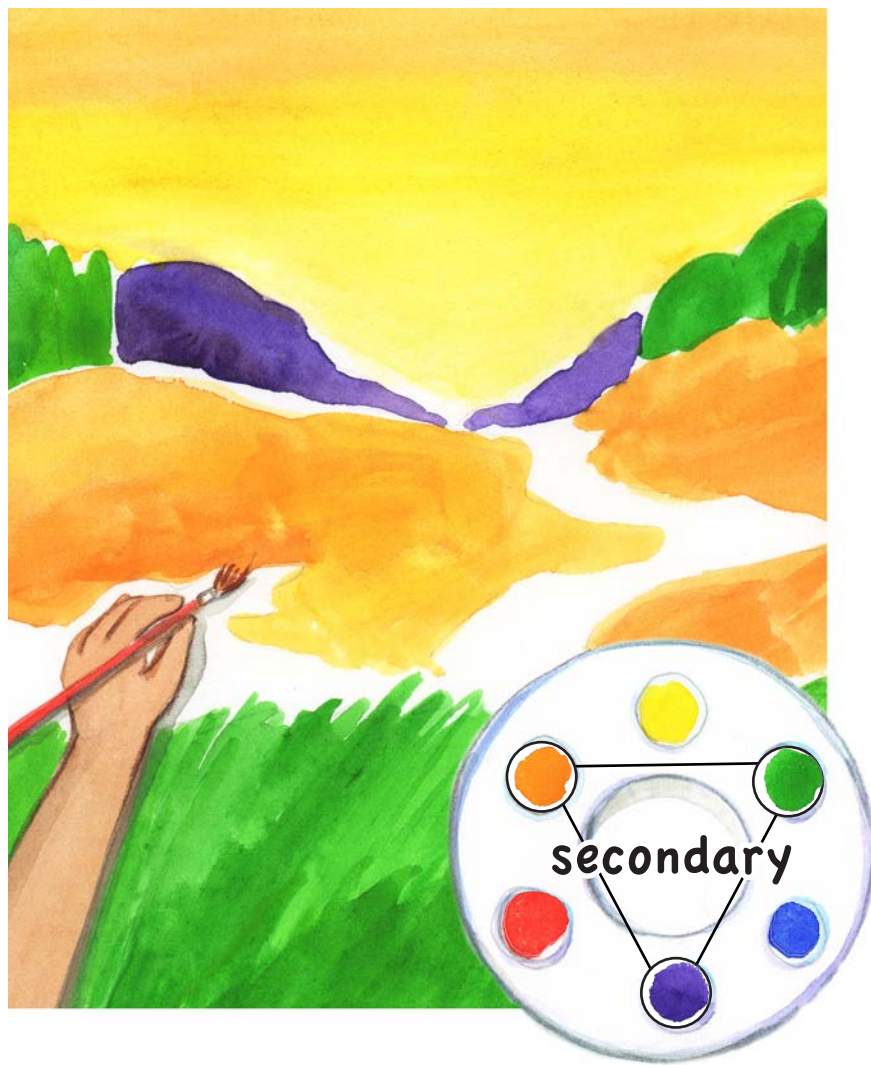


What colors will I choose for my paintings?

are cool colors.



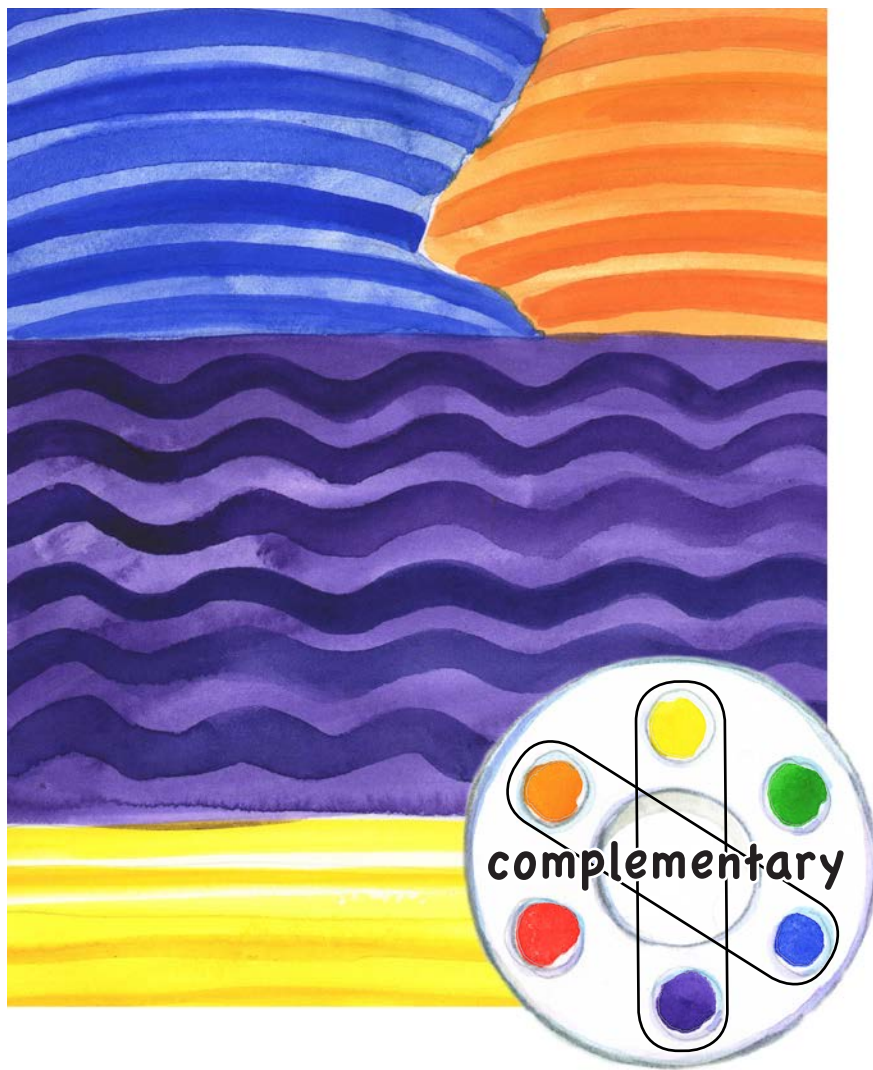
I will choose shades of colors
